Rotherfield Surgery Driveway:


Following feedback from parishioners the council arranged for the Surgery driveway to be repaired making it easy for all to access.

Speedwatch Campaign:

One of the main concerns we hear from the Parish residents is the speed and erratic driving from people driving through and between the villages. To help us record these speeds we're hoping to reinstate the local Speedwatch Group, but **in order to do this we need your help**. We have a couple of volunteers already, but desperately need more if we are able to progress with the campaign. SID Statistics High Cross:

Throughout February and March the council's Speed Indication Device (SID) has been deployed on the B2101 at High Cross:



We are pleased to see that the majority of the vehicle are sticking to the speed limit. However, there are a number of vehicles that are still driving above the speed limit. Please adhere to the speed limit when driving through all areas of the parish. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.



B2100 Speed Petition Update:

"The Petition endorsed by the council about safety on the B2100 west of Rotherfield was formally considered by the County Council last month. Thank you for having signed it in November! They decided speed limits are 'not a priority' compared with more dangerous Sussex sites, and the other requests don't match their criteria either. They will 'investigate' replacing the broken reflectors on the fatal bend, and 'review' traffic signage. Disappointing result, but if there's another disaster, we'll try a new petition then."

Councillor Hobbies – Cllr Kember's Lockdown:

"Light aircraft have been an important part of my life since my father took me to Rochester Airport when I was about 8 years old. As a qualified designer and motor engineer and the owner of a local motor car dealership he explained to me that aeroplanes represented the finest form of transportation engineering. When I was 14 years old I joined the local Air Cadets in Tunbridge Wells and I flew in many different RAF aircraft of the time, Chipmunks, Ansons, Beverleys, Hastings, Jet Provosts and Britannias.



I bought my first aeroplane in 1985 and have owned and flown my own aeroplane regularly since then, often in connection with my work as an aviation planning consultant.

Looking for speed and economy of operations in Tunbridge Wells I built the first British-designed Europa kit plane in 1995 and another (kit number 1000) in Eridge in 2005. During the recent lockdown and unable to fly for 5 months I looked around for a project to work on in the garage adjoining my house in New Road, Rotherfield.

In December 2020 I bought a partially-constructed Viking Cygnet (plans-built) aeroplane from a man who had started building it in 1992 but had to give up recently when he developed severe Alzheimer's disease at age 72.



Since December I have spent over 500 hours assembling and disassembling, finishing and painting the aeroplane. In the next month I hope to transport it to a nearby Aerodrome for ground and flight testing. I have thoroughly enjoyed working on this project and it has kept me fully occupied during what for many has been a very trying time. I thoroughly recommend an absorbing hobby as a way of dealing with Covid".
