# 3. TO CONSIDER INFORMATION AND MAKE DECISIONS ON ACTIONS AND EXPENDITURE AS REQUIRED REGARDING THE FOLLOWING ITEMS

# i. Review and discuss options for protecting the damaged face of the Kings Arms Pub.

One member of the public updated the Committee on the current status of repairs and planning applications regarding the Kings Arms.

It was **AGREED** that as this item had been raised by a Councillor who could not attend the meeting, the item would be placed on the Highways, Lighting & Transport Committee set for the 14<sup>th</sup> January 2025. **Clerk** to add an item to the agenda.

## ii. Receive an update on flooding issues across the Parish.

Documents relating to this item had been circulated to Councillors ahead of the meeting.

The Clerk reported that he had chased East Sussex Highways with regard to the drain at the bottom of the unadopted Horsegrove Lane. They are still awaiting further information on the suggestion of the Highways Steward to relocate the drain. Cllr Standley has offered to follow this up.

The Clerk confirmed that he had approached Wealden District Council about the Council's offer of installing a drainage trench at the bottom of New Road. This has been escalated and Cllr Lunn Supports the Council in resolving this. The Clerk will keep Councillors updated as information is received.

Councillors felt that raising the kerbstones and granite sets in front of the affected properties at New Road/Horsegrove Lane was the best solution. However, East Sussex Highways had ruled this out.

It was **AGREED** that the Council should purchase additional flood protection measures, including sandbags and flood water diversion barriers. **Clerk & Cllr Beach** to investigate and arrange purchase. These would be made available to parishioners on a request basis.

Cllr Harris suggested that we arrange for the drains on New Road to be cleared as well. **Clerk** to raise an order for the clearing of the drains.

# iii. Review and discuss the August & September SID data.

Documents relating to this item had been circulated to Councillors ahead of the meeting.

The Committee reviewed the data that had been circulated for each location:

# August 2024 - Padfield Close - Traffic coming into the Village:

Average Speed: 30mph

Top Speed Recorded: 62mph

85th Percentile: 35mph

# September 2024 - Station Road - Traffic heading into the Village:

Average Speed: 30mph

Top Speed Recorded: 58mph

85th Percentile: 28mph

It was **AGREED** that this data would be published in the Parish Council Newsletter. Additional sites for the Speed Indication Devices are to be considered. **Clerk** to circulate the existing list of sites to Councillors.

## iv. Review commissioned works for Streetlamp repairs and maintenance.

The Committee felt that the delay in work on the streetlamps was not acceptable. Six streetlights signed off in April 2024 had yet to have work carried out on them. It was **RESOLVED** that the Clerk would raise the matter with East Sussex Highways and the County Councillor.

# v. Discuss and review works around Eridge Station..

The Clerk reported that our contactor has now added tidying and maintenance outside of the station to his regular job list. We have also advanced our Station Partnership to care for the platform's planters.
